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Nancy E. Willard received a Bachelors of Science in Elementary and Early Childhood Education from the University of Utah in 1975, a Masters of Science in Special Education from the University of Oregon, 1977, and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from Willamette University College of Law in 1983.

Nancy taught "at risk" children with emotional and behavior difficulties, practiced law in areas of computer law and copyright, and provided consulting services to schools on the implementation of educational technology, before focusing her professional attention on issues of youth risk online and effective student Internet use management in schools.

Nancy is director of the Center for Safe and Responsible Internet Use. This Center provides for educators and other professionals on youth risk online issues. She frequently lectures and conducts workshops for educators on policies and practices related to Internet use in schools and has written numerous articles on this subject. She is expanding her ability to present online workshops for professionals and is creating narrated presentations for teacher professional development and parents.

Nancy's book, *Cyberbullying and Cyberthreats: Responding to the Challenge of Online Social Aggression, Threats, and Distress* (2007 Research Press), provides educators and other professionals with insight into the concerns of cyberbullying, plus guidance on how schools can implement a comprehensive plan to address cyberbullying through policies, Internet and cellphone use management, education of students and parents and a process to investigate cyberbullying incidents and effectively respond.
